


Climate crisis - implications for Lepidoptera?

Five warmest years in the UK (Met Office)

- Changes of distribution
- Migrants ⇒ residents (including pests and diseases)
- An extra brood?
- Heatwaves desiccated food plants, lack of honeydew and nectar?
- Warmer, wetter winters parasites?
- Phenology out of sync with food plants or nectar?

Overview of the last 3 years for the Branch

- Membership income now over £8,000, up from £7,000 p.a.
- Maintained the Branch's expenditure on conservation work
 - Average £3,000 p.a.
 - More work parties
- Contributed over £40,000 to BC Projects over 3 years
 - Nearly £5,000 p.a. from Branch funds
 - Plus £26k legacy from Eric Wynn estate
 - More projects in the Branch area
- ⇒ Total Conservation spend ca. £8,000 p.a. from Branch funds
- ✓ Enabled by reducing the Branch's core costs by nearly 50%

 e.g. road verges, parks










"We Love Heart Moth" Project

- Targetted surveys, 7 sites in 2019
- Found at Harewood Estate (51)
 and Windsor Great Park (1)
- Other Nationally Notable moths recorded - Festoon, Rosy Marbled,
 P. subcinerea and P. branderiana
- Larvae feed on oaks: concern re.
 spraying for control of Oak
 Processionary Moth





- All records in NMRS (10km squares)
- Records 2019
- Unsuccessful targetted searches 2019








Branch activities in London

- Eight London Boroughs (3 + 5)
- Transects, now 33 (10 + 23)
- Surprisingly good for Lepidoptera
 - Often 25+ species in Inner London green spaces
 - 30+ in Outer London
 - White-letter and Purple Hairstreaks are well distributed
