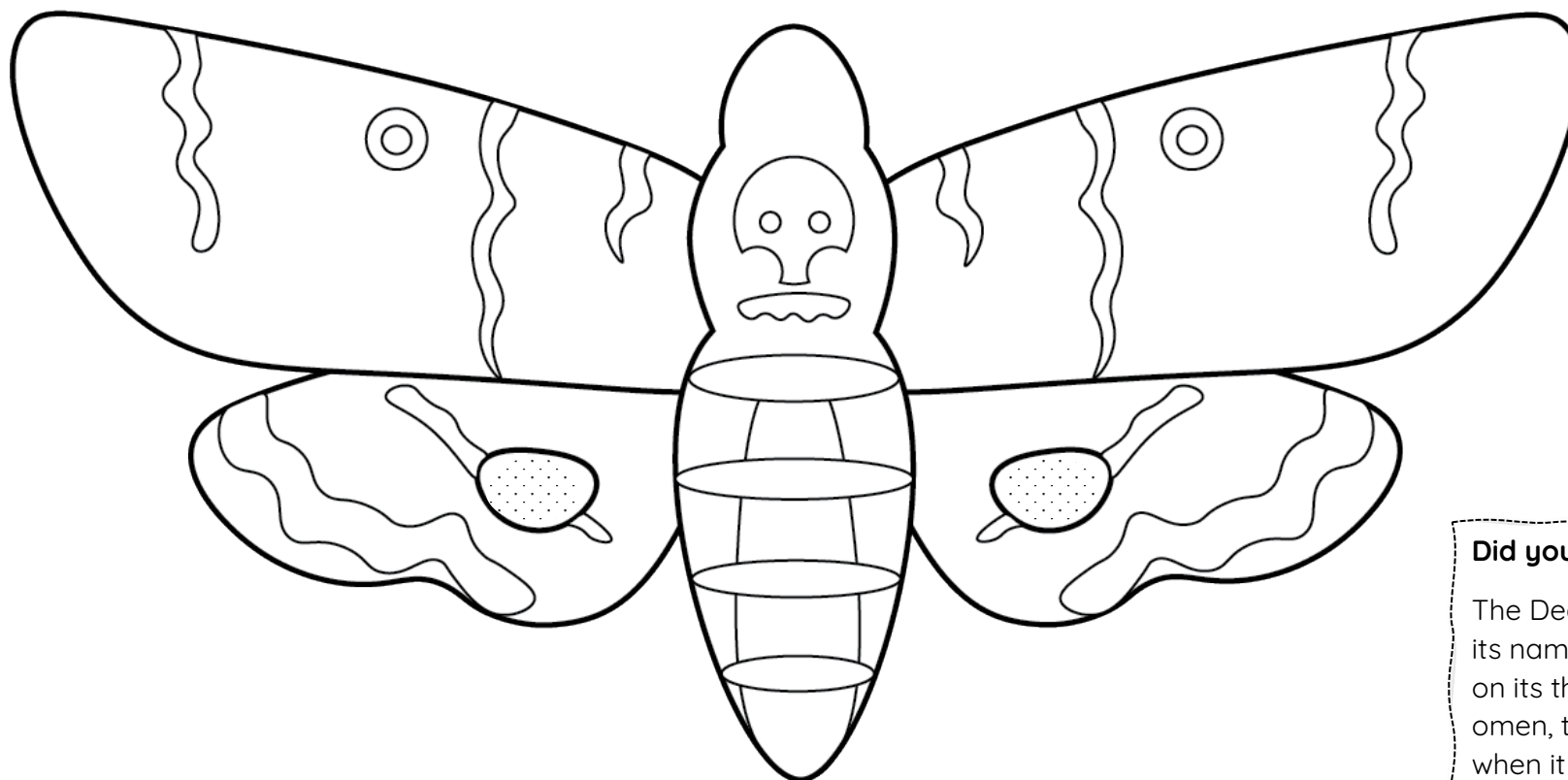


Make a moth mask

1. Ask an adult to help you cut out your mask template. The eye holes can be very tricky, so it's best to let an adult do this bit for you.
2. Decorate your mask using coloured pens, pencils, leaves, or anything else you like.
3. Sellotape a straw or lollipop stick to the back of your mask near the bottom so that you can hold the mask up to your face and pretend to be a moth!



Did you know?!

The Death's-head Hawk-moth gets its name from the skull-like pattern on its thorax. Once seen as a bad omen, this moth squeaks loudly when it feels threatened!
